Admission to the Sixth Form will be subject to the following criteria:

Students must achieve a minimum of **28 points** from their **best eight GCSE results**, with at least Grade 5 in English and Grade 5 in Maths **for the A Level route**. A GCSE Points Score of **30 points** will be required to follow the **Combined route** of entry and additional qualifications. **Students will be considered on a case-by-case basis for the Combined route of entry and additional qualifications.** Please visit <https://www.collegeofthespiritschool.co.uk> to calculate your points score.

The GCSE Points Score is a points total which counts a student's best 8 GCSE grades including English and Maths.

In the event of over-subscription, the following (in addition to the above) will apply:

1. Looked after children will be given first priority.
2. In the event of over-subscription, places will be based on a first-come, first-served basis, with those living nearest being accorded the higher priority.
3. For the purposes of Points 1 and 2 above, the school does not distinguish between internal and external applicants.

Applications should be returned to the school by the submission date for the application form (Mon 18 Dec 2023). Late applications will be considered on an individual basis.
